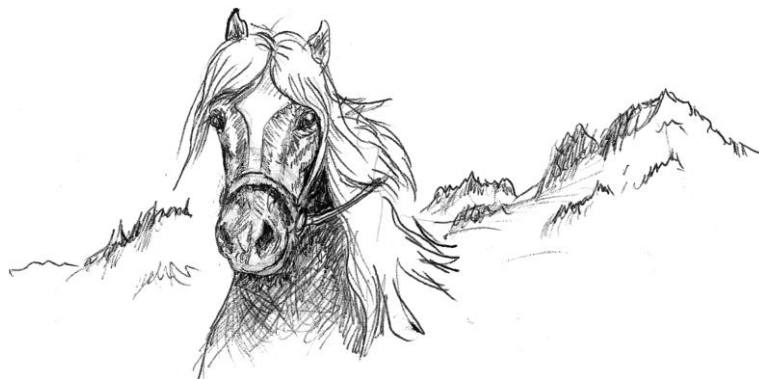
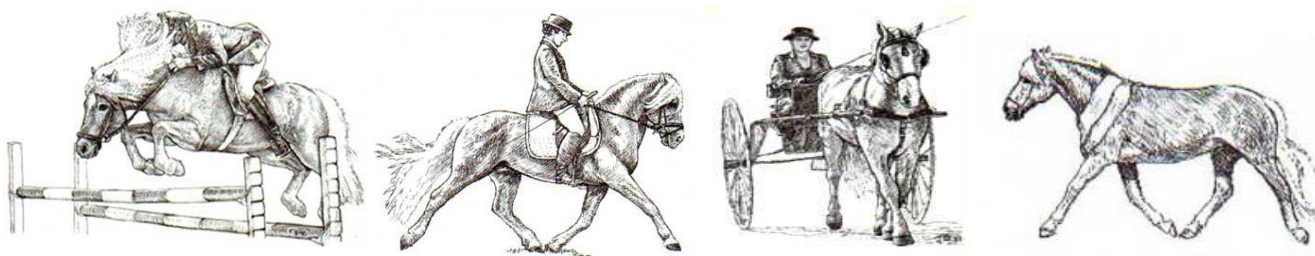

### Advice & Guidelines

#### Training

Individuals entering training clinics should wear normal show attire

#### Ridden

Jackets for ridden classes may be black, navy, green, brown or hacking jackets. It is incorrect to wear a flower with a hacking jacket, but a real or silk flower may be worn with a showing jacket.

It is generally considered more correct to wear a hacking jacket in Working Hunter Pony classes and unaffiliated Dressage, but showing jackets may be worn.

In unaffiliated show jumping any jacket may be worn.

It is considered incorrect to wear a numnah in any showing class.

The elements judged in a showing class are manners, conformation, type and way of going plus ride where applicable.

#### In Hand

Foals – headcollars, foalslips or halters

Yearlings and 2 year olds - usually a show bridle or leather headcollar with or without a bit

Older males – bridle with a bit, but no crupper or side reins

Older mares – headcollars, show bridles or riding bridles with a bit

It is correct to carry a whip, preferably plain leather covered cane, but a schooling whip is sometimes necessary to ensure youngstock run out well.

## General Information

## Safety

The Society require us to appoint a Safety Officer. Please make life easier for everyone by thinking about safety at all times whilst on the showground and respecting any instructions from committee members.

**STALLIONS** All competitors are reminded to allow stallions and their handlers enough space for safety. Whilst it is the responsibility of the owner that any entire brought onto the showground is totally under control, other owners, handlers and riders must behave sensibly and allow adequate room for stallions and colts.

**VEHICLE ACCESS** – Follow signs into the lorry park. Please park tidily to allow others adequate room.

**PARKING** only in designated areas

# Rules of the Show

1. All ponies entered must be registered with the Haflinger Society of Great Britain, within stud book Sections 1 or 2, and be owned or on long-term loan or lease to a member of the Society.
2. All competitors / trainees must be a fully paid up member of the Haflinger Society of Great Britain
3. **All horses must be accompanied by a valid passport. Random inspections may be undertaken for the duration of the show.**
4. All competitors must be ready to enter the ring when called; the judge reserves the right to refuse entry to latecomers. If you are delayed in another class you must send a representative to the steward of your next class explaining your position. Please note that classes will not be held ahead of the *catalogued* times, but will not be held up for late entries
5. The judge's decision is final at all times.
6. Any horse not sufficiently under control or considered unsafe shall be removed from the ring immediately at the request of the judge.
7. The Show Steering Group reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes.
8. Warwickshire College reserve the right to cancel, add to or amend any of the Competitions as they see fit due to weather conditions etc.
9. Neither Warwickshire College, nor any of its representative or staff or the Society shall be held liable for any accident, injury or damage or loss whatsoever, howsoever caused to any person animal or property at any time.
10. A junior or young rider competitor must be able to provide proof of age to the organisers should there be any doubt as to his/her eligibility to enter a class. Ages will be taken as from the day of the show. **A responsible adult, who must be named on the entry form, must accompany juniors.**
11. Any competitor wishing to make a protest, in relation to any horse exhibited at the show must make the same in writing, to the Show Secretary, within thirty minutes of the class being judged and deposit the sum of £10 which may, at the discretion of the Show Steering Group, be forfeited to the Society fund if the objection is disallowed.
12. No horse under the age of four years may be ridden on the venue
13. No competitor / rider shall allow a stallion for which they are responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete, in any competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure competitors, officials or other members of the public are not put at risk of injury. No stallion may be ridden on the showground or in competition by children under the age of 14 years.
14. Dressage classes will be judged in accordance with British Dressage Rules 2012.
15. The wearing of spurs is forbidden for riders 16 years and under in all classes
16. **Whips are not to exceed 30"/75cms in length in any class except Dressage or when riding Side-Saddle.** Misuse of a whip will not be tolerated and judges will be asked to notify the Show Secretary of any such incidents, whether in or out of the arenas. Persistent offenders may be excluded from the show.
17. Martingales are not allowed in any ridden class.
18. Once a class has started no change of rider will be allowed.
19. All trophies are perpetual and remain the property of the Haflinger Society of Great Britain. Trophies must be professionally machine engraved at the winners expense before return. **Trophies taken home are the responsibility of the person who signs for them up to a maximum value of £100.**
20. Stables may only be occupied by those who have booked and prepaid for them with show entries and allocated by the Show Secretary. You may request stables adjacent to friends on your entry form. No change of allocated stable is permitted without the approval of the show secretary. Owners stabling their horses on the showground accept liability for any damage caused to their stable(s).
21. No horses to be administered any medical substance without evidence of an accompanying letter from a Veterinary practice verifying treatment course
22. Please dispose of your litter thoughtfully in bins provided.
23. Please do not muck out into car parks.
24. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas, and prohibited around the stable blocks.
25. All dogs must be kept on leads. If dog owners do not clean up their own dogs mess, this privilege will be removed
26. All horse and ponies must only move through areas shared with pedestrians at walk.
27. Children must be under adult supervision at all times
28. All competitors/riders must wear correctly fastened hats to current approved safety standards. The only exception is in the Side Saddle class. The wearing of Beaglers IS NOT permitted in any class regardless of the experience of the rider.
29. Correct riding and driving attire must be worn in the ring when competing, or in the case of handlers, grooms and dressage / riding test callers, correct stable dress may be worn. The stewards may refuse entry to anyone not properly attired.
30. Entries received after the close of entries will be required to pay the stated surcharge before they are allowed to compete.
31. Reimbursement of entry fees will only be considered if a doctor's or vet's letter is supplied and the Show Secretary is notified prior to the commencement of the class. Stable, straw and evening meal tickets cannot be reimbursed unless the Show Secretary is notified at least 7 days prior to the show. Efforts will be made to sell surplus evening meal tickets, but this cannot be guaranteed. An administration fee of £10 will be deducted from any refunds given.
32. It is a condition of entry that all competitors, exhibitors, families and employees abide by the show rules.

## Dressage

Class No	Class Description	Day / Ring / Time	Entry Requirements
1	Dressage Training	Indoor Assigned	Training for competitors prior to them competing in their test. Groups will be no more than 4 riders and will all be at the same level.
2	Restricted Dressage	Indoor Assigned	Riders any age, combination not to have been placed 6 <sup>th</sup> or above in the level of test entered. Arena 20 x 40. Bridles according to BD rules 2012 only. BD Introductory B, Prelim 1, Novice 30, Elementary 42
3	Open Dressage	Indoor Assigned	Open to all riders, any age. . Combination can only compete at Prelim if they have not been placed 1 <sup>st</sup> - 6 <sup>th</sup> in any dressage class. Arena 20 x 40. Bridles according to BD rules 2012 only. Prelim 13, Novice 28, Elementary 50

Horses to compete at their current level (or above) if registered with British Dressage.

4	Ridden Show Training	Indoor Assigned	Training for anyone wanting to learn about ridden showing. Groups will be no more than 6 riders and will all be at the same level.
5	Novice Ridden	Indoor Arena 11:15	Riders any age (will be split if enough entries received) Open to horses who have not won a ridden showing class (including ridden pairs) at any show. NB: Winners of this class may still compete at Novice showing at this year Breed Show.
6	Open Ridden	Indoor Arena 12:00	Riders any age (will be split if enough entries received) Horses may be ridden by the judge

7	In Hand Training	Covered Arena Assigned	Training for anyone wanting to learn about in hand showing. Groups will be no more than 6 handlers and will all be at the same level.
8	Youngstock	Covered Arena 14:00	Open to Youngstock aged 1 – 3 yrs
9	Senior	Covered Arena 15:00	Open all horses aged 4 and over
